

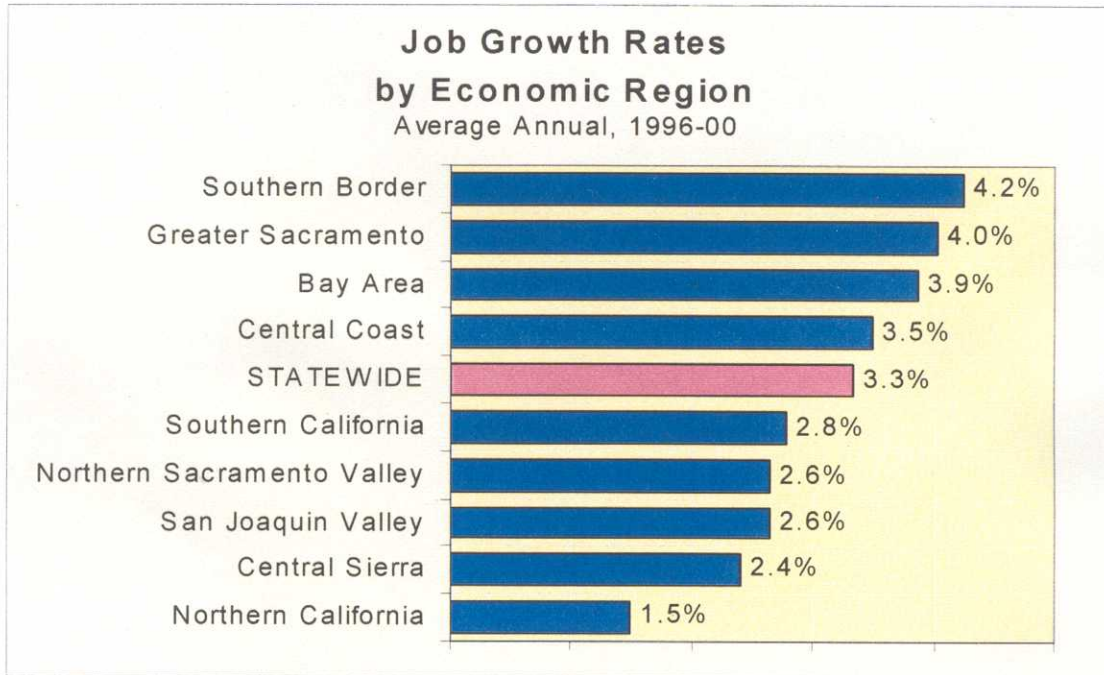

Job Growth Rates by Economic Region

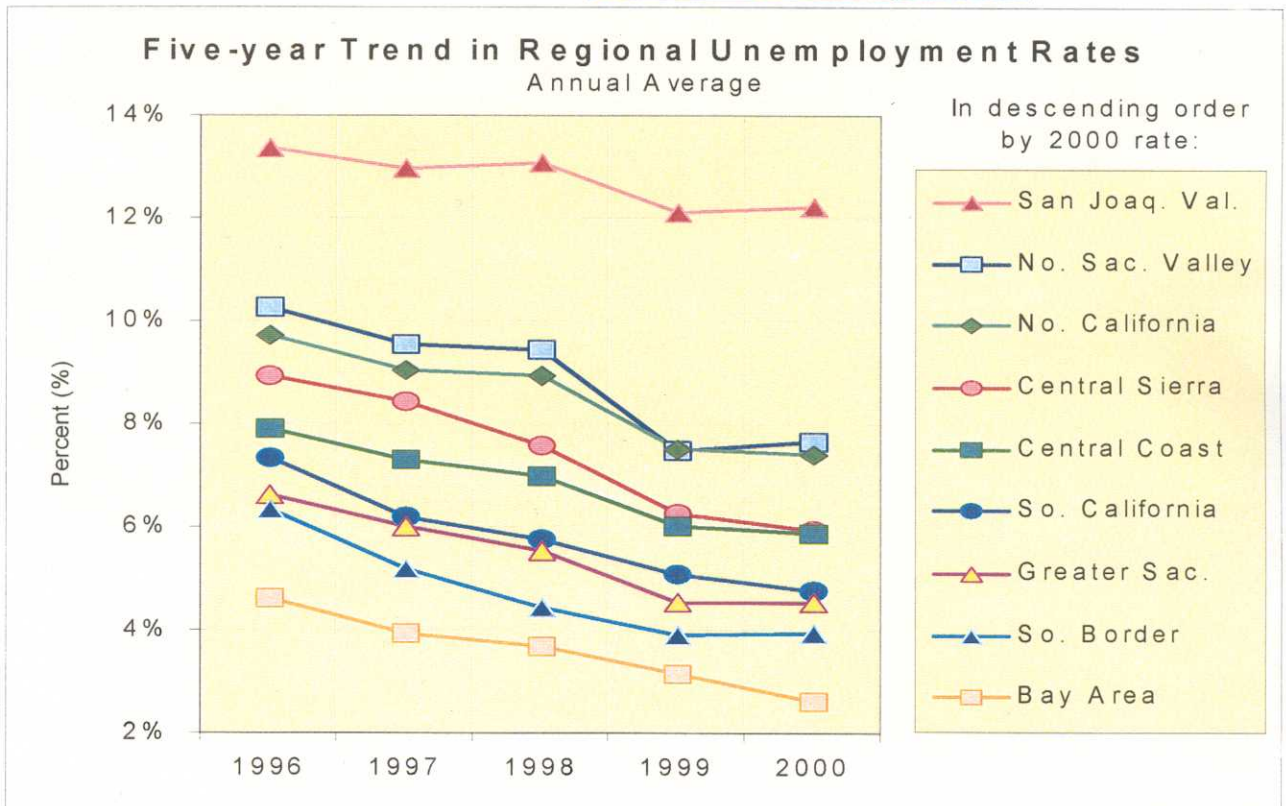

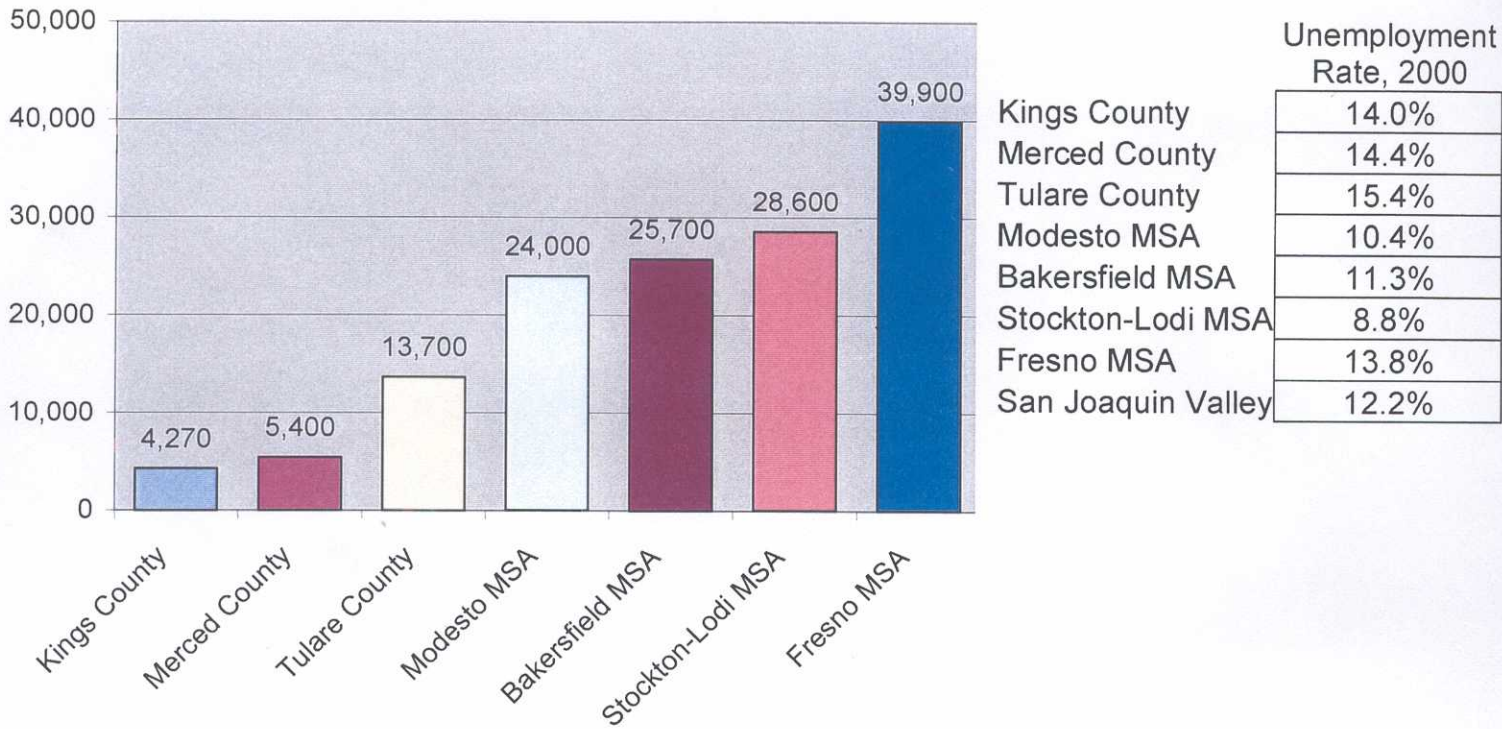
Five-Year Trend in Regional Unemployment Rates (1996-2000)

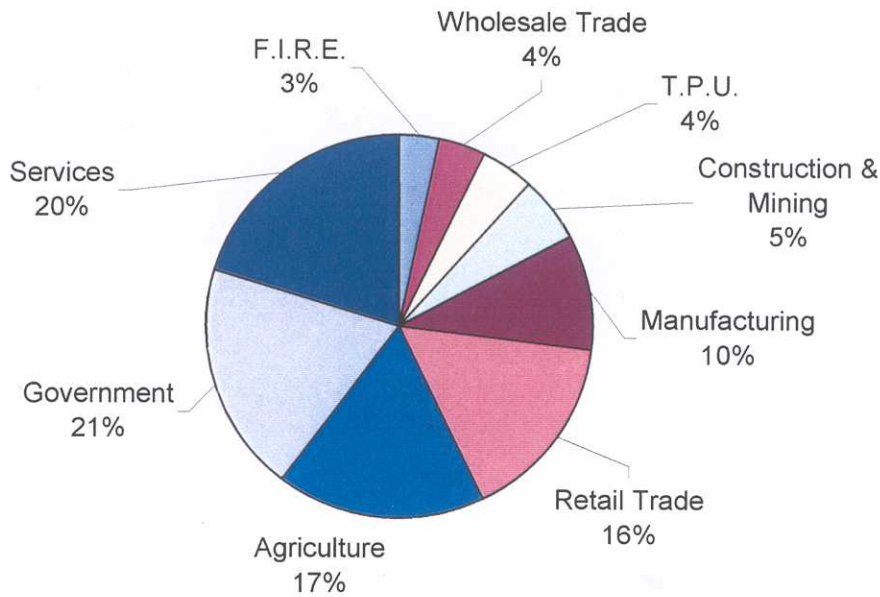
**The San Joaquin Valley Region's MSAs and Counties

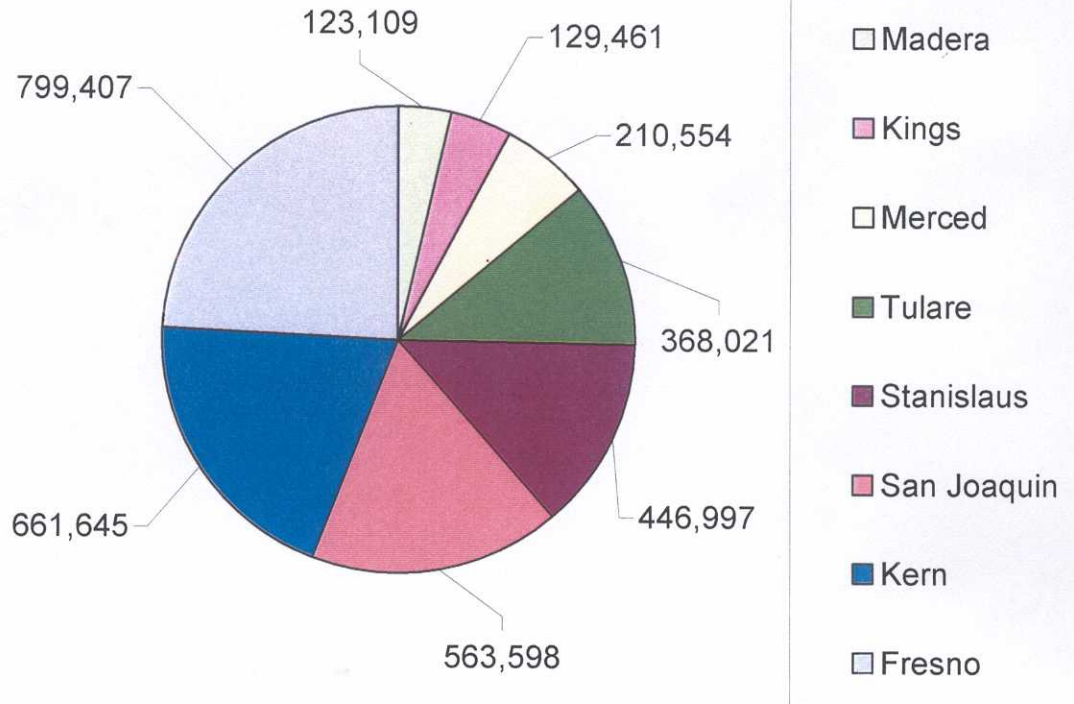

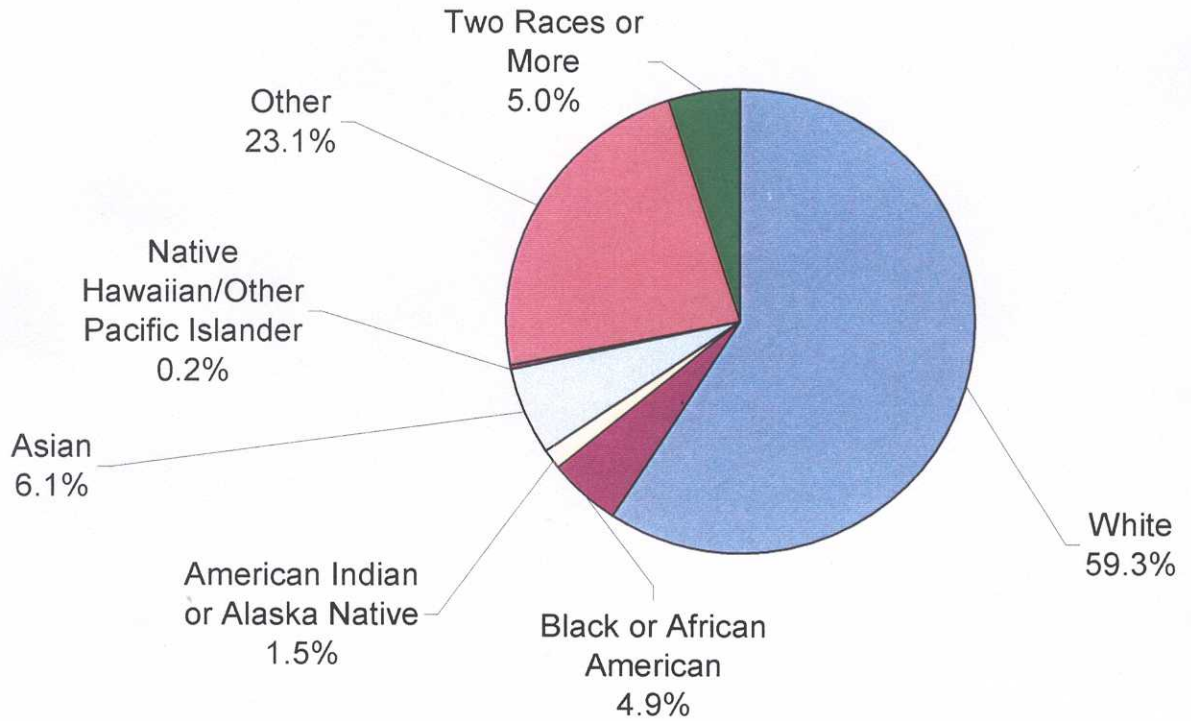
Interim County Projections – San Joaquin Valley Region Estimated July 1, 2000 and Projections for 2005, 2010, 2015, 2020

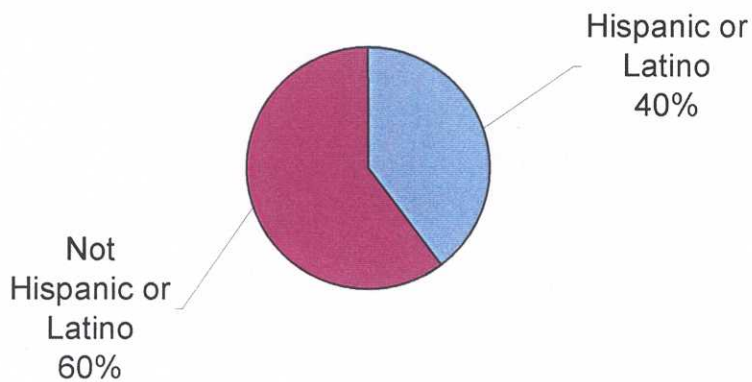

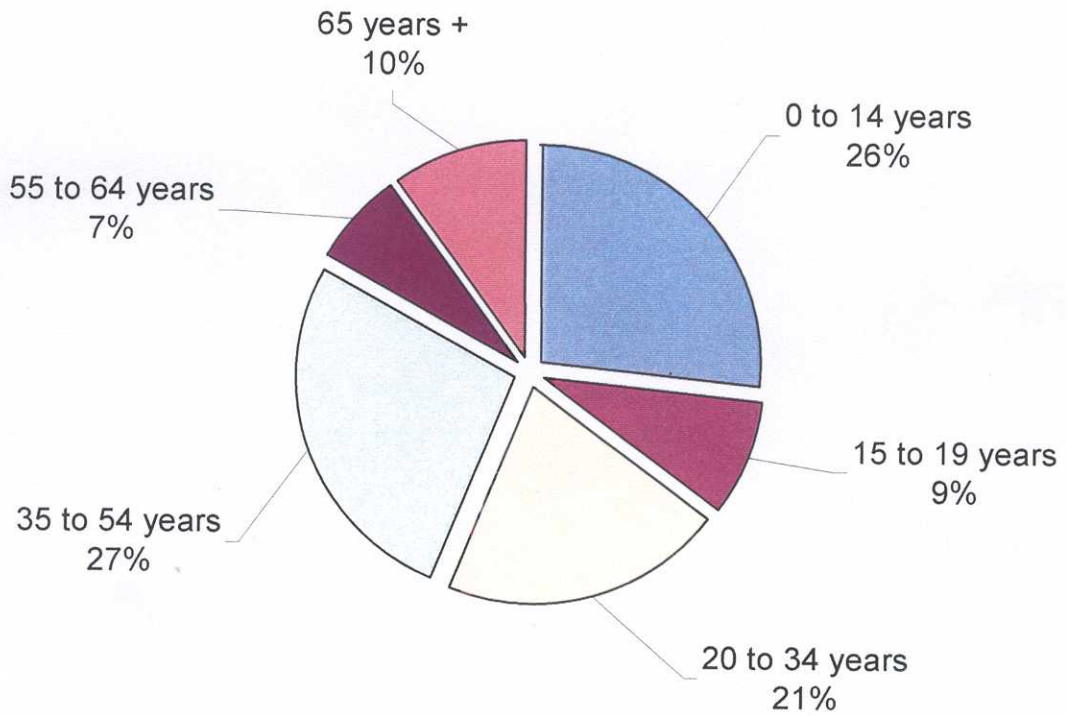

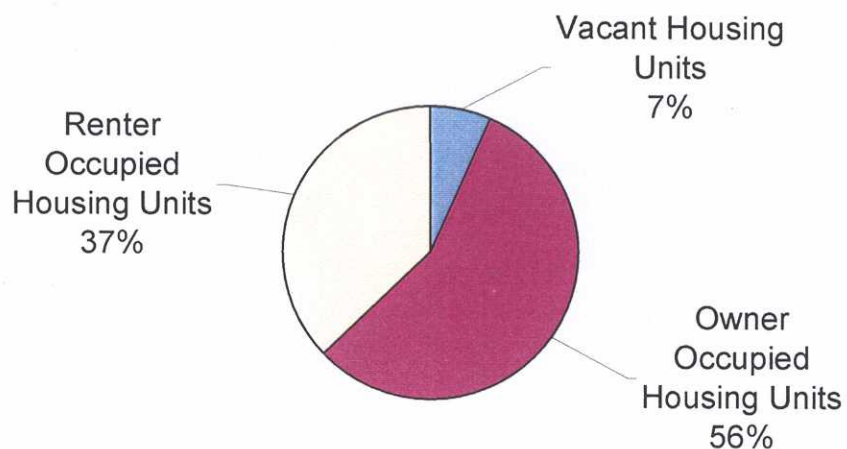
