Asset Mapping & Gap Analysis Introduction

Asset mapping and gap analysis is analogous to the “chicken or egg” dilemma. However, “mapping or gapping” is not a choice that has to be made since mapping assets automatically lead to a determination of which assets are not available in a given community.

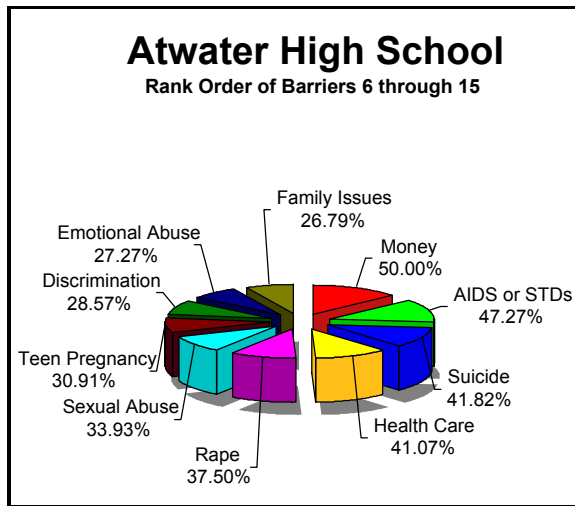
To determine the needs of the young people in Merced County, the Youth Council’s Planning and Quality Assurance Committee conducted a survey of high school age youth during summer school at seven Merced County high schools.

This survey (Attachment 1) identified the top 15 concerns of the students and further identified the concerns by the demographics of the target group and at each individual survey site. The table below displays the barriers to success for the group as a whole.

As was expected, based on when and where the survey was conducted, the top five concerns were, for the most part, the same as a group and at all seven sites. An example of the survey results (graphing only concerns six through 15) is provided and forms the basis for the asset mapping and gap analysis efforts that follow.

The process of mapping assets began with identifying resources by services offered and organizations offering those services by community. This was done over a period of one year and included exhaustive research and coordination with as many organizations with similar data bases in the County as possible.

Below is an example of the data base (abbreviated) that is used for this process.

As stated before, youth oriented service assets were identified for each community based on the Needs Assessment Survey conducted at each associated school site. Every effort was made to identify every service available related to the order of barriers determined by the students who participated in the survey.

The larger communities in the County enjoy a greater number of available services than do the smaller cities and municipalities.

Atwater, the second largest city in the county, and Le Grand, the smallest, are exceptions. Gaps appear for four of the 15 barriers for Atwater while Le Grand youth have access to services for all 15 of the barriers identified due to its proximity to the City of Merced.

Dos Palos lacks identifiable resources in eight areas, while Gustine, because of its location near Hilmar and Los Banos resources, has only five barriers without services.

Livingston, Los Banos and the City of Merced are well served. Livingston has four areas with gaps in services, Los Banos just two, while Merced has available services for all 15 barriers noted by the survey.

This initial output for each community is the beginning of a very dynamic process which must be updated through additional surveys and services inventory continuously.

Once the information has been presented to appropriate city and county officials, the Youth Council will request that after review, they be notified of any assets available and not identified or those no longer being provided within their community identified by this initial effort.

When those are received, a second, more comprehensive document can then be produced and published for the county as well as those communities included in the initial survey.

The next step in this process as it is seen is for the Youth Council and PITD staff to assist communities with funding resources and other available grants in an attempt to fund services and resources to fill the identifiable gaps.

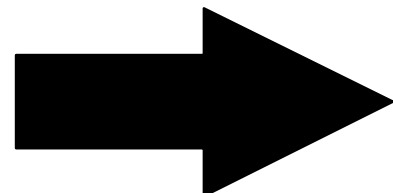

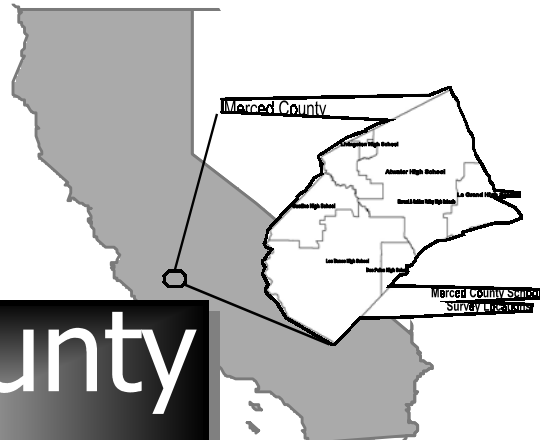

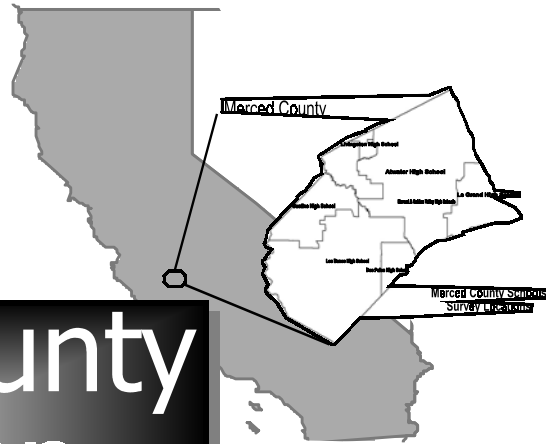
